

### Message from the Chair

During this reporting period the workload the number of development proposals submitted to the EISC was less when compared to the past several years. However, the nature and complexity of some developments proposals and the Committee's revisions to their Operating Guidelines and Procedures resulted in a full agenda for the year.

The EISC produced draft revisions to their Operating Guidelines and Procedures in December 2007 which were widely distributed or comment. The responses received will help guide the development of second draft which the Committee plans to have completed in 2008/2009.

The training of the Members and enhancing the capacity of the Committee is a priority for the EISC. To this end the Members attended a number of workshops and meetings. To improve the efficiency of the Committee's screening of developments the EISC converted to paperless meeting binders. This undertaking reduced the burden on the Joint Secretariat and the agencies and organizations which provide advice to the Committee.

The Committee's operations benefited from having a full complement of members for the reporting period. At this time I would like to acknowledge the EISC members and the Committee as a whole for their hard work and the passion they bring to their work. Many of the Members manage to carry out their EISC responsibilities while holding down full time employment.

Early in the year when the Committee was without a Coordinator members of the Joint Secretariat supported the EISC; their support was most appreciated. Barb Chalmers was hired in the summer of 2007 and organized the office and the administration of the Committee. The EISC would not have been able to function effectively nor would have been able to make the conversion to the digital world without the tireless efforts and enthusiasm of the EISC Coordinator. The Committee also benefits from the administrative support and advice from the Joint Secretariat staff, namely Dr. Norm Snow, Connie Gordon, Erica Lugt, Meeka Kisoun, Bernice Joe and Peggy Madore; to all we extend our appreciation.

### Period of this Report

The Environmental Impact Screening Committee (EISC) has produced twenty annual activity reports since its inception in 1986. This report describes the EISC's activities for the fiscal period of 1 April 2007 to 31 March 2008 – its twentieth year of operation.

### The Inuvialuit Final Agreement

On June 5, 1984, the Committee for Original Peoples' Entitlement (representing the Inuvialuit) and the Federal Government of Canada signed the Inuvialuit Final Agreement (IFA), which was subsequently legislated under the Western Arctic (Inuvialuit) Claims Settlement Act [S.C. 32-33 Elizabeth II C.24.]. Provisions of the IFA enable the Inuvialuit to participate and be meaningful partners in all decisions-making processes dealing with the management of the environment and wildlife within the Inuvialuit Settlement Region (ISR). Section 1 of the IFA expresses the following principles.

- To preserve the Inuvialuit cultural identity and values within a changing northern society
- To enable the Inuvialuit to be equal and meaningful participants in the northern and national economy and society
- To protect and preserve arctic wildlife, environment and biological productivity

As one of five co-management groups established under the terms of the IFA, the EISC plays a vital role in achieving these stated goals through implementing the screening portion of the IFA Environmental Impact Screening and Review Process.

### Mandate of the Environmental Impact Screening Committee

The Western Arctic (Inuvialuit) Claims Settlement Act and the IFA take precedence over any other federal, territorial, provincial, or municipal law to the extent of any inconsistency or conflict between them. Developers, operators, and regulatory agencies are compelled by this act to comply with the provisions of the IFA Environmental Impact Screening and Review Process.

The IFA requires the screening of developments and activities of consequence to the ISR that could have a significant negative impact on the environment or wildlife harvesting. The IFA also dictates that regulatory agencies must not issue

licenses or approvals that permit any development to proceed without environmental screening and, if necessary, review.

Section 11 of the IFA provided for the establishment of the EISC to carry out the screening of relevant developments. Provisions governing the activities and operation of the EISC are described mainly within Section 11 and 13. Section 11.(17) requires the EISC to make one of the following decisions after examining a project description.

- a) that the development will have no significant negative impact and may proceed without environmental impact assessment and review;
- b) that the development, if authorized subject to terms and conditions recommended by the Screening Committee, will have no such significant negative impact and may proceed without environmental impact assessment and review;
- c) that the development could have significant negative impact and is subject to assessment and review; or
- d) that the development proposal has deficiencies of a nature that warrant termination of its consideration and submission of another project description.

Subject to the aforementioned provisions, the EISC produced its Operating Guidelines and Procedures, which governs its routine activities in regard to the actual screening of development proposals.

### Membership

The EISC consists of seven members, including the Chair. The Inuvialuit Game Council (IGC) appoints three members. The Government of Canada (Canada), the Yukon Territorial Government (YTG), and the Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT) nominate one member each, who are then appointed by the Government of Canada. The Government of Canada with the consent of the IGC appoints the Chair. Each member is appointed for a three-year term with the option of re-appointment if agreed to by the nominating and appointing bodies.

The EISC is considered an institution of public government. The members contribute to the deliberation of the Committee as experienced individuals and not as representatives of their appointing body.

### Administrative and Technical Assistance

The EISC receives administrative, technical, and clerical support from the Joint Secretariat – Inuvialuit Renewable Resource Committees situated in Inuvik, NT. The EISC Environmental Assessment Coordinator who serves as the Secretary to the EISC provides full-time assistance. Agnes Noksana left the EISC in May 2007. Katherine Thiesenhausen and Richard Binder of the Joint Secretariat assisted the Committee for the month of June. Barb Chalmers was hired on a temporary basis in June 2007 and was later hired fulltime in September.

During the period of this report the EISC also received administrative support from various employees of the Joint Secretariat including: Dr. Norm Snow, Executive Director; Connie Gordon and Peggy Madore, Senior Administrative Officer; Robin Carpenter, Erica Lugt, and Donna Firth, Finance Officers; Meeka Kisoun, Travel/Accommodation Coordinator; Bernice Joe, Secretary/Receptionist; Myrna Button, Office Clerks/Librarians; and Michael Kohler, GIS Operator; and Eli Arkin, EIRB Coordinator.

### **Activities**

Members attended screening meetings approximately every five weeks and participated in other activities on behalf of the EISC, as required, to fulfill the mandate of the EISC.

### Regular meetings

The EISC held 10 meetings in Inuvik, NT on the following dates:

April 25-27, 2007; May 30 – June 1, 2007; July 4-6, 2007; August 8-10, 2007; September 12-14, 2007; October 21 & 22, 2007; December 12-14, 2007; January 30 – February 1, 2008; February 27- March 1, 2008.

In addition to the regular meeting the EISC held 4 conference calls on the following dates: July 9, 2007, September 20, 21 & 25, 2007, October 29 & 30, 2007 and March 13, 2008.

### Submissions

It is the responsibility of the proponent to submit a project description to the EISC for environmental screening. Screening decisions are made by a panel of five EISC members. The Panel consists of the Chair, two Inuvialuit members, the Canada member, and the Territorial member nominated by the territory (YT or NT) within which the project is to occur. Decisions are made on a majority vote basis, with the Chair voting only in the case of a tie.

In regard to submissions received by the EISC, 2007/2008 was not a busy year when compared with the previous few years. 41 descriptions were submitted. However, the complexity of some of the proposals and the associated issues created additional work for the Committee.

Of the total submissions, 3 project descriptions were withdrawn by the proponent prior to the completion of the screening process: 2 tour businesses.

No projects were referred to the Environmental Impact Review Board.

In summary, the EISC screened 41 project descriptions during 2007/2008 including: hydrocarbon exploration projects (6); mining exploration projects (6); reclamation and cleanup projects (6); fuel tank upgrading (2); off-shore equipment/fuel storage (2): government research projects (8); university research projects (6); tourism projects (3); and filming projects (1).

During 2007/2008 the EISC decided that:

Twelve of the proposed developments would have no significant negative impact, 24 developments would have no significant negative impacts with recommended terms

and conditions. One project was determined to be deficient. Two projects were found to be exempt. Two projects were withdrawn by the proponent.

The screening process for the majority of submissions (n = 29, 71%) required less than 60 days to complete, 15 percent (n = 6, 15%) of the submissions were screened in less than 30 days from the date of receipt, requiring a resolution by the EISC to waive the standard requirement. None of the project submissions were deemed to have the potential for significant negative impact. Please refer to the end of this report to view a summary table of this year's screening decisions (Appendix A).

In addition to developments that are screened, the EISC asks to be informed of other projects that are proposed for the Inuvialuit Settlement Region, but for various reasons are exempt from the screening process. This task is undertaken so that the EISC may have a broad picture of the activities being carried out within the ISR for the purposes of cumulative impact assessment. The EISC greatly appreciated the efforts of the other co-management groups, the government agencies, the Aurora Research Institute and the Inuvialuit Land Administration during the reporting year to keep the EISC apprised of such activities.

The exempted projects in 2007/2008 were research projects that had gone through the IFA co-management process, were non-government sponsored or funded research, or developments occurring on Inuvialuit Private Lands.
