




Figure 1. Private Inuvialuit Lands, Crown Lands and National Parks within the Inuvialuit Settlement Region.

The Inuvialuit Settlement Region is well served by their representatives and I invite you to verify below who these fine individuals are. Their roles in fulfilling the mandate of the EISC are at times challenging, yet they tackle the task with enthusiasm and a very strong sense of purpose.

A special thank you is express on behalf of the committee members to Mr. Johnny Lennie for his service of as the Acting Chair for the first seven months of the reporting period, April 1, 2010 to March 31, 2011.

The activity level for the period was marginally below the average of the past five years with no discernable trend apparent. The main activities are in expected areas of Oil and Gas, and Research projects.

During this reporting period the Committee completed final consultations and the final drafts of the new Environmental Impact Screening Guidelines and the new Rules of Procedure for the Environmental Impact Screening and Review Process of the Inuvialuit Final Agreement. These are public documents that will guide our activities for many years, thus they took considerable time and effort to bring to this state. We thank everyone who provided feedback during our consultations. These documents will be released to the public and put into practice early in the new year.

Looking ahead to the coming year the EISC expects work volume to remain steady. With this said work will continue to provision more efficient and effective operations, with an expectant eye for an inevitable increase in activity.

Period of this Report

The Environmental Impact Screening Committee (EISC) has produced twenty four annual activity reports since its inception in 1986. This report describes the EISC's activities for the fiscal period of 1 April 2010 to 31 March 2011 – its twenty fifth year of operation.

The Inuvialuit Final Agreement

On June 5, 1984, the Committee for Original Peoples' Entitlement (representing the Inuvialuit) and the Federal Government of Canada signed the Inuvialuit Final Agreement (IFA), which was subsequently legislated under the Western Arctic (Inuvialuit) Claims Settlement Act [S.C. 32-33 Elizabeth II C.24.]. Provisions of the IFA enable the Inuvialuit to participate and be meaningful partners in all decisions-making processes dealing with the management of the environment and wildlife within the Inuvialuit Settlement Region (ISR). Section 1 of the IFA expresses the following principles.

- To preserve the Inuvialuit cultural identity and values within a changing northern society
- To enable the Inuvialuit to be equal and meaningful participants in the northern and national economy and society
- To protect and preserve arctic wildlife, environment and biological productivity

As one of five co-management groups established under the terms of the IFA, the EISC plays a vital role in achieving these stated goals through implementing the screening portion of the IFA Environmental Impact Screening and Review Process.

Mandate of the Environmental Impact Screening Committee

The Western Arctic (Inuvialuit) Claims Settlement Act and the IFA take precedence over any other federal, territorial, provincial, or municipal law to the extent of any inconsistency or conflict between them. Developers, operators, and regulatory agencies are compelled by this act to comply with the provisions of the IFA Environmental Impact Screening and Review Process.

The IFA requires the screening of developments and activities of consequence to the ISR that could have a significant negative impact on the environment or wildlife harvesting. The IFA also dictates that regulatory agencies must not issue licenses or approvals that permit any development to proceed without environmental screening and, if necessary, review.

Section 11 of the IFA provided for the establishment of the EISC to carry out the screening of relevant developments. Provisions governing the activities and operation of the EISC are described mainly within Section 11 and 13. Section 11.(17) requires the EISC to make one of the following decisions after examining a project description.

- a) that the development will have no significant negative impact and may proceed without environmental impact assessment and review;
- b) that the development, if authorized subject to terms and conditions recommended by the Screening Committee, will have no such significant negative impact and may proceed without environmental impact assessment and review;
- c) that the development could have significant negative impact and is subject to assessment and review, or
- d) that the development proposal has deficiencies of a nature that warrant termination of its consideration and submission of another project description.

Subject to the aforementioned provisions, the EISC produced its Operating Guidelines and Procedures, which governs its routine activities in regard to the actual screening of development proposals.

Membership

The EISC consists of seven members, including the Chair. The Inuvialuit Game Council (IGC) appoints three members. The Government of Canada (Canada), the Yukon Territorial Government (YTG), and the Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT) nominate one member each, who are then appointed by the Government of Canada. The Government of Canada with the consent of the IGC appoints the Chair. Each member is appointed for a three-year term with the option of re-appointment if agreed to by the nominating and appointing bodies.

Even though particular groups appoint the members, the EISC serves as a non-partisan organization. The members are expected to contribute as experienced individuals and not as representatives of their appointing body.

Administrative and Technical Assistance

The EISC receives administrative, technical, and clerical support from the Joint Secretariat – Inuvialuit Settlement Region situated in Inuvik, NT. The EISC Environmental Assessment Coordinator who serves as the Secretary to the EISC provides full-time assistance. Barb Chalmers has been working in this position since June 2007 and left for maternity leave in June 2010. Phillipa Vos was the Coordinator to the EISC for a brief time. Christine Inglangasuk is now the Environmental Impact Screening Coordinator.

During the period of this report the EISC also received administrative support from various employees of the Joint Secretariat including: Dr. Norm Snow, Executive Director; Peggy Madore, Senior Administrative Officer; Mary Banksland, Office Manager; Erica Lugt, Finance Officer; Shannon Jensen, Travel/Accommodation Coordinators; Bernice Joe, Secretary/Receptionist; Myrna Button, Office Clerks/Librarians; and Eli Nasogaluak, EIRB Coordinator.

John Donihee, John Donihee Professional Corporation provided contractual legal services.

Activities

Members attended screening meetings approximately every five weeks and participated in other activities on behalf of the EISC, as required, to fulfill the mandate of the EISC.

Regular meetings

The EISC held 7 regular meetings in Inuvik, NT and one in Calgary, AB on the following dates: April 12 - 14, 2010, June 2 - 4, 2010, July 6 - 9, 2010, August 16, 2010, October 6 - 8, 2010, November 3 - 5, 2010, January 26-28, 2011, and March 9-11, 2011.

In addition to the regular EISC meetings the following meetings were held to work on the revisions to the Operating Guidelines and Procedures and projects that provided information requested by the EISC:

- April 23, 2010 meeting to discuss the Inuvik to Tuktoyaktuk Highway.
- May 19, 2010, meeting to discuss two developments within the Inuvialuit Settlement Region.
- July 30, 2010, to decide on a development which information that was required was now available.
- August 25, 2010, to discuss two projects that required screening.
- February 16, 2011, to discuss the EISC Operating Guidelines and Rules of Procedure.
- March 18, 2011, to discuss a project that provided more information that EISC requested.

Submissions

It is the responsibility of the proponent to submit a project description to the EISC for environmental screening. Screening decisions are made by a panel of five EISC members. The Panel consists of the Chair, two Inuvialuit members, the Canada member, and the Territorial member nominated by the territory (YT or NT) within which the project is to occur. Decisions are made on a majority vote basis, with the Chair voting in the case of a tie.

Of the total submissions, no project descriptions were withdrawn by the proponent prior to the completion of the screening process.

One project was referred to the Environmental Impact Review Board.

In summary, the EISC screened 46 project descriptions during 2010/2011 including: Hydrocarbon Oil and Gas related projects (17); Research projects (17); Tourism projects (5); Seismic projects (2); Clean Up projects (1); Infra-Structure projects (2); Filming projects (2).

During 2010/2011 the EISC decided that:

Thirteen of the proposed developments would have no significant negative impact, seventeen developments would have no significant negative impacts with recommended terms and conditions, one project was sent for review to the EIRB and five project descriptions were deficient. Nine projects were exempt.

In addition to developments that are screened, the EISC asks to be informed of other projects that are proposed for the Inuvialuit Settlement Region, but for various reasons are exempt from the screening process. This task is undertaken so that the EISC may have a broad picture of the activities being carried out within the ISR for the purposes of cumulative impact assessment. The EISC greatly appreciated the efforts of the other comanagement groups, the government agencies, the Aurora Research Institute and the Inuvialuit Land Administration during the reporting year to keep the EISC apprised of such activities.

The exempted projects in 2010/2011 were research projects that were non-government sponsored or funded research, projects that did not fit the definition of developments under the Inuvialuit Final Agreement, or developments occurring on Inuvialuit Private Lands.
